We'll soon start major renovations on both our primary care sites that will allow us to provide 15,000 more appointments each year and create a built environment that communicates value to every neighbor who comes to us for care.

MILDRED

A JOURNEY *of* HOPE

Mildred lived with her parents in Santa Rosa Copan, Honduras. Her daughter was born prematurely, and the baby's father abandoned them. It was very hard to make ends meet as a single mom, so Mildred decided to come to the United States.

In April of 2021, Mildred traveled from Honduras to Mexico with her infant daughter. She walked for almost six days with little food and water. She didn't realize it at the time, but Mildred was pregnant with her son on the journey.

Once she reached Mexico, Mildred paid a coyote to float her and her infant daughter across the border. Family in the states helped them make their way to Houston, North Carolina and finally Alabama. Knowing she needed medical attention, Mildred's aunt made her an appointment at Christ Health in Chalkville. Dr. Newton determined that Mildred was 8 to 9 months pregnant, and she gave birth to her son soon after at St. Vincent's Hospital downtown.

Christ Health gifted Mildred with diapers, clothing, car seats, strollers, blankets — everything she needed to care for her babies while she started a new life. She says she is very blessed to have found Christ Health and will continue to visit the clinic. She misses her family back in Honduras but is looking forward to a brighter future.

MARCIA

KEEPING *the* FAITH

Marcia’s husband, a church deacon, passed away in May of 2018. Three days later, her house burned down, and she was in a serious car accident in February of 2019. She left the hospital with a shattered ankle and steel rod in her leg. The doctors were skeptical she would ever walk again.

“I felt like I was drowning,” she said. “I would stay up all night and only go to sleep when mom woke up in the morning — I knew she was a nurse and wouldn’t let me die.” Marcia had severely abused alcohol for years, but decided to stop after the accident. However, in September of 2019, she was diagnosed with stage 4 cirrhosis of the liver.

On a friend’s advice, she went to see Dr. Rogers at Christ Health in Chalkville. He told Marcia, “I can help you, but you’re going to help yourself

first.” Dr. Rogers created a treatment plan for her and helped Marcia understand how to monitor her sodium intake. She began to watch her diet, and most importantly, began to hope again.

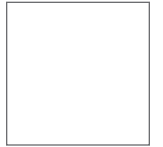
